Graduation Requirements & Class Offerings

Wayne Country Day School offers a traditional college preparatory curriculum in the upper school based on a 38-week semester system. Classes meet 50 minutes each day. Each semester course earns 0.5, and a full year course earns 1.0 credit. Graduation requires a minimum of 24 credits.
